




HELPFUL TOOLS FOR THE FAMILY CAREGIVER

LONG-TERM CARE CALCULATOR

When you are seeking out long-term care for a loved one, getting them the highest quality care available is, of course, your priority. Second is often the affordability of care so be ing able to accurately calculate the cost is very important. This long-term care calculator estimates the cost of care so that you can determine the most economical options. The calculator also allows you to compare the cost or care be tween two different areas, which might be helpful if multiple siblings live in different cities and are trying to determine the best place for a parent to reside.

STATE-BY-STATE ADVANCE DIRECTIVES

Advance directives allow a person to outline what kind of health care they want at the end of their life so that their wishes are carried out when they can no longer express their wishes.

These documents allow a person to outline not only what kind of treatments they wish to receive but also to name a power of attorney, giving someone else the power to make health care decisions for them if need be.
